General Information Paper

I. Background

The Asia and the Pacific Seminar on Educational Technology - 2007 (Tokyo-2007 Regional Seminar hereafter) is, in principle, the 6th in the series of activities agreed upon by participating countries during the "First Seminar-Workshop of the Seventh Programming Cycle of APEID Activities." The Workshop was organized by Tokyo Gakugei University, the Council of National University Centers for Educational Practice Research of Japan and the Japanese National Commission for UNESCO, under the cooperation programme of the Asia Pacific Programme of Educational Innovation for Development (APEID), UNESCO Asia and Pacific Regional Bureau for Education, Bangkok, Thailand. The first in the series was held on 15-22 October 2002 in Tokyo Japan. The Final reports of previous five Seminar-Workshops can be accessed at http://gauge.u-gakugei.ac.jp/apeid/apeid.html.

Tokyo Gakugei University, the host institution of the 2007 Seminar, has been organizing educational innovation activities on educational technology, teacher education and environmental education since 1974. The University is recognized as a key institution in implementing innovative programmes and activities in "Information and Communication Technology (ICT)" and Education for Sustainable Development (ESD). The educational innovation programmes have been marked as a systems approach to learning, and have been recognized as inevitable for the sound development of education in the region. The modalities are: conducting regional workshops and seminars for human resource development, strengthening cooperation and promoting mutual understanding among Member States; organizing attachments for young researchers; and mobile training programmes, wherein key educators and experts visit 'Centers of Excellence' in selected Member Countries for enhancing learning and cooperation in research and development. The different modalities have established a strong network of experts in the Asia Pacific Region.

With the utilization of rich human networks and expertise, Tokyo Gakugei University has been recognized as a key institution for driving forward ESD with ICT. ESD covers broad spheres of study and research - environment, welfare, peace, development, gender, human rights education for children, education for international understanding, the eradication of poverty, literacy, AIDS, education for ending strife, etc. In principle, ESD leads to mutual understanding and the sharing of values in order to cope with globalization, information-oriented and lifelong learning society in the context of "Learning the Treasure Within", promoting the "Four Pillars of Learning."

The theme of the 2007 Seminar is on 'Promotion of ESD-ICT Integration and Teacher Training,' strongly focusing on the remarkable trends like 'The TV is going digital, while the computers are going visual'. It is in this regard that the Tokyo Seminars are organized.

II. Objectives of the Seminar and Expected Outcomes

The Seminar will bring together international, regional and national experts on ICT and Audio-Visual Technologies, Pre-Service and In-Service Teacher Trainers, and ESD, to:

- 1. Present their programs and innovative practices on ICT- Audiovisual Technologies and ESD Integration to promote quality education;
- 2. Develop guidelines for ICT-Audiovisual Technologies and ESD Integration to improve the preand in-service teacher training curriculum towards quality education;
- 3. Prepare exemplar curriculum models based on the guidelines;
- 4. Formulate strategic plans for the creation of a regional/international network for higher education and teacher training institutions for developing programmes, sharing research ideas and progress on ICT-Audiovisual technologies and ESD integration; and
- 5. Propose recommendations for follow-up actions and plan for the Tokyo-2008 Regional Seminar.

The expected outcomes are:

- 1. Documentation of the national programmes and innovative practices on ICT-Audiovisual Technologies and ESD Integration for promoting quality education;
- 2. Guidelines for ICT-Audiovisual Technologies and ESD Integration to improve the pre-service and in-service teacher training curriculum towards quality education;
- 3. Exemplar curriculum models based on the guidelines;
- 4. Strategic plans for the creation of a regional/international network for higher education and teacher training institutions
- 5. Recommendations for follow-up actions and plans for the Tokyo-2008 Regional Seminar.

Interested Professionals from Japan and other regions are welcome to participate AT THEIR OWN COST.

Nominations are expected to be received by the Organizing Institution latest by **25 September 2007.** The attached "Nomination Form" must be completed and sent preferably by Fax (+81-42-329-7404) to the Seminar Organizers. An Acceptance Letter will be sent to the Prospective Participant, either by e-mail, fax or letter.

VI. Working Language

The Regional Seminar will be conducted in English.

VII. Preparatory Work of the Participants

1. Participants are expected to prepare a regional or country report on their programs and innovative practices on ICT- Audiovisual Technologies and ESD Integration to promote quality education. The Report should include: (1) (a) Statement of National Policies, Executive Orders, Ministry of Education Promulgations; (b) National/regional guidelines for implementation in terms of: teacher training curriculum, training practices, assessment processes and research; (c) Exemplars of

curriculum models/ innovative practices developed by the institutions; (d) Existing Collaborative Activities between educational institutions and other interest groups including the NGOs in promoting and utilizing ICT-Audiovisual technologies and ESD integration towards promoting quality education; (2) Recommendations for future actions.

- 2. The paper should not exceed 5000 words or about 10 pages in A4 or letter-sized format.
- 3. Develop a MS PowerPoint presentation to summarize the report for a 15 minute presentation.

For the presentations the following equipment are available:

- (a) IBM PC/AT compatible desktop Internet-connected computers
- (b) Computers connectable to the LCD Projectors and VCRs.
- 4. The Participants should send both the full paper and presentation by e-mail at the latest by <u>15</u>

 October 2007, to the Organizing Committee, Tokyo Gakugei University, Tokyo Japan.
- Every participant is also requested to bring 25 printed of his/her papers and software with USB memory or CD-ROM. It is preferable that the text is recorded in MS-Word on MS-Windows.

The Participant from ICTE is requested to present a paper on 'International Trends and Prospects of Research and Development on ICT-Audiovisual Technologies and ESD Integration in Teacher Education and Training and Human Resource Development."

The Representative from APEID, UNESCO Asia and Pacific Regional Bureau for Education, Bangkok will please present a paper on 'Global and Regional Trends and Prospects of ICT- Audiovisual Technologies and ESD Integration for the Promotion of the Quality Education and Progress on the Celebration of the Decade of ESD 2005-2014 with Regard to Teacher Training.'

IX. Financial Arrangements for Participants

The Seminar Organizers will provide all the official foreign participants with an economy class round-trip air ticket from the international airport on the capital of the country to the New Tokyo International Airport (Narita). A Special Rate out-of pocket allowance/per/diem will be provided to cover the participants' accommodation, foods and a part of miscellaneous expenditures while in Japan. Other expenses incurred while obtaining the visa and travel insurance will NOT be covered by the organizers.

1. To enter Japan, the participant should possess a valid passport or travel document with an entry visa for Japan obtainable at the Japanese consular offices in the respective country.

Those who need a specific document such as the invitation letter to Tokyo Seminar-2007 in order to get an entry visa will have to send their request to the the Organizers.

- 2. An economy return air ticket will be sent to each participant through a travel agent in each country as soon as the nomination is received and acknowledged by the Organizers.
- 3. Those participants coming from or in-transit in infected areas of diseases designated as quarantinable are requested to have a valid certification of vaccination. Expenses necessary for inoculation of vaccination will NOT be covered by the Organizers.
